Corydon Meyer, as President and Chief Executive Officer of the Company ("Mr. Meyer"), is hereby authorized, directed and empowered, in the name of and on behalf of the Company, to execute, verify and cause to be filed the Petition, including the schedules of assets and liabilities, the statement of financial affairs and other ancillary documents required by the Bankruptcy Code and the Federal Rules of Bankruptcy Procedure to be filed with the Petition or thereafter; and

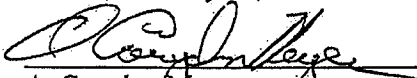

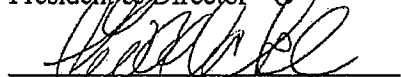

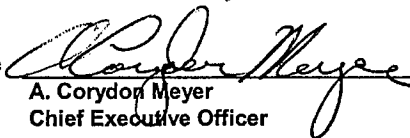
